Transfer Options

Associate in Arts and Associate in Science Degrees

Applicants holding an Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, or Associate in Arts and Sciences from an Illinois community college are admissible as juniors and are considered to have met the general education requirements.

Illinois articulation initiative (IAI)

UIS is a participant in (IAI), a statewide agreement designed to allow you to transfer your general education credit, as well as credit earned in select majors, between participating institutions, For more details refer to the UIS catalog or www.itransfer.org

OTHER ADMISSION

Students waiting to get an early start on their studies at UIS can be admitted if they have completed a minimum of 30 transferable semester hours of college work from a regionally accredited college or university. Policy requires a minimum cumulative 2.0 grade point average (4.0 scale)

Admission to the junior year at UIS is granted to applicants who have completed 60 semester (90 quarter) hours of credit with a minimum cumulative 2.0 grade point average (4.0 scale) from a regionally accredited college or university. In addition, 37 semester hours of general education courses must be completed before graduation from UIS; it is preferred that these hours be completed prior to admission to UIS. Of these 36 hours, a maximum of 12 hours (taken at UIS) may count toward the upper-division degree credits at the discretion of the academic programs.

To avoid extending the number of courses necessary once at UIS, students are encouraged to complete the following general education courses **Prior to admission to the university**.
