The Alice Kaige Papers, 1965-1986, consist of the Central Illinois Area, Midwest Regional AFSC records and West Side Neighborhood Association records. Memorabilia of local women's and cooperative organizations are also included.

The collection chiefly consists of minutes, notes, reports, program proposals, newsletters, newspaper clippings and correspondence of the Central Illinois AFSC from 1974-1980, and documents the establishment of the Central Illinois AFSC as a full-time office; relations of the Central Illinois to the Midwest Regional AFSC, particularly to the Peace Education Committee, and the Central Illinois AFSC activities in the Springfield, Decatur, and Champaign/Urbana area. These activities included military counseling, juvenile justice work, and maintaining a "Peace Booth" at the Illinois State Fair, as well as supporting the programs of the Midwest Office.

The collection also contains reports, speech transcripts, organizational materials, program plans and proposals, minutes, policy directives, news clippings, newsletters, flyers, staff lists, and originals and copies of inter-office correspondence of the Midwest Regional AFSC office in Chicago dating from 1975-1976. A considerable portion of the material was generated by the Peace Education Committee (or directed toward it) concerning educational peace programs and campaigns, as well as proposals for such activities. Among these activities and proposals are an anti-B1 Bomber campaign, Middle East education, Vietnam War "Reconciliation", a "New Economic Order" program, and an August 1976 peace walk.

Also included are several pro-Equal Rights Amendment posters, newsletters of the Spoon River Book Cooperative, a newsletter, the Anima Rising, of the Alliance of Women in Change, copies of the 1976 Illinois People's History Calendar, and pages from the 1974 Illinois People's History Calendar.
