

5 WAYS YOU CAN USE...

Interactive Whiteboards

1 Save annotations made on a presentation during lecture into PowerPoint to upload for students to view later.

2 Analyze works of art or pictures by writing directly on the image and pointing specific characteristics.

3 Annotate essays and papers to provide students examples of grading marks and your rubric.
Capture annotations to share them on Blackboard or your class website.

4 Go through math problems step-by-step then capture the screen to distribute to students. This is a great way to reduce the use of paper!

5 Use SMART Exchange to demo and download templates for interactive games to add some fun to reviews!



More Ideas for Using Interactive Whiteboards...

- Build a timeline as a class allowing students to move various objects or text boxes
- Have students create interactive lessons to present to the class using SMART Notebook, a software free for them to download
- Create PowerPoint presentations for notes and leave blank spaces on the slides. Fill out the blanks with the pen during the lecture to keep students on task with their own note-taking
- Never again be hassled with broken chalk or dried out markers!
