The University of Illinois Springfield Prairie Stars play the Wisconsin-Parkside Rangers today at 5:30 p.m. at The Recreation and Athletic Center in the "Pack the TRAC Pink" game.

Fans are encouraged to wear pink to the Great Lakes Valley Conference to help raise awareness for breast cancer.

The Stars (7-17 overall, 2-14 in the GLVC) have won two of their last three games with victories against Oakland City and St. Joseph's. Wisconsin-Parkside is 19-5 and 13-3 and received votes in this week's USA Today/ESPN NCAA Division II Top 25 women's poll.

UIS concludes the season Saturday against Lewis.

### Eagles race past Mount Mary

MILWAUKEE — Robert Morris University shot 48.5 percent from the field in the second half Tuesday night to pull away from Mount Mary College 85-66.

The Eagles connected on 16 of 33 field goal attempts in the final 20 minutes to expand a 36-29 halftime lead.

Eunice Gill scored 19 points and grabbed seven rebounds for RMU (17-7), and Megan Smith contributed 18 points and six rebounds. Megan Krone had a team-high 11 rebounds.

Jordan Osley scored 27 points to lead Mount Mary (5-18).

### Russell, Cougars pounce on Loggers

Simone Russell scored 26 points to lead Illinois Central College to a 77-67 win over Lincoln Land Community College on Wednesday.

Two other Cougars players, Laci Peterson (16 points) and Courtney Townsend (14), scored in double figures.

The Loggers led 30-28 at halftime.

Four LLCC players, led by Jasmine Johnson's 17 points, reached double figures in points while Johnson also pulled down 13 rebounds to record a double-double.

### Bals, Berry lead IC over Fighting Scots

JACKSONVILLE — Craig Bals scored a career-high 29 points and Brandon Berry added 18 to lead Illinois College to a 98-80 Midwest Conference win over Monmouth College.

Monmouth (3-19, 1-16 in Midwest Conference) led by as many as eight points in the first half, but the Blueboys (15-7, 11-6) bounced back and took the lead for good with 3 minutes remaining before intermission and led by four at halftime, 44-40.

Bryce Donaldson led four Scots in double figures with 18.

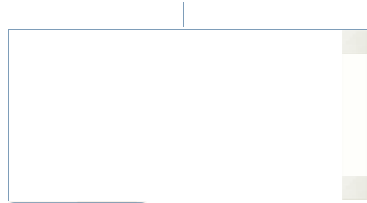
