Mathematics	One or two courses. Two courses needed if transferring into UIS with less than 30 hours of college credit.	3-6
Physical and Life Sciences	Two courses: select one physical science, one life science <b>OR</b> two interdisciplinary science courses (LP900 or LP900L and LP 901 or LP901L. At least one must be a laboratory course.	7-8
Humanities and Fine Arts	Select at least one humanities course and at least one fine arts course; the third may be either.	9
Social and Behavior Sciences	Select 3 courses from at least two different disciplines.	9
