Topics in Comparative Religion (HIS 150) 3 Hrs.

Europe (HIS 202) 3 Hrs.

U.S. (HIS 204, HIS 205) 3 Hrs.

Middle East (HIS 160, HIS 211) 3 Hrs. each

East Asia (HIS 176, HIS 177) 3 Hrs. each
