*The production support classes, THE 109 and THE 209 are graduation requirements for the Theatre major; they do not carry any credit, however they do require time spent working on the production being presented by UIS Theatre in the respective semester. A significant amount of time spent outside of class is required.

**THE 475 (Theatre Practicum) recommended; see below regarding eligibility for THE 475.

Theatre Majors are eligible to use their positions with UIS Theatre productions as credits for THE 475 - Theatre Practicum. THE 475 is required for graduation. Our Majors are required to complete 3.0 credit hours of this class over the course of four years, but it is always dependent upon whether or not they are selected as part of a given semester's production team. Therefore, it is not a class for which they can necessarily plan to enroll, but when the opportunity arises they need to consider adding that credit. The course is variable in its hours, up to 4 credit hours, but that determination is at the discretion of the faculty depending upon the size of the commitment to the show.
