




### A ROAD MAP FOR THE FUTURE



### 2000 MASTER PLAN

The last comprehensive master plan completed at UIS was adopted in 2000. At that time, the University was situated on the same 740 acres with 42 buildings representing 765,000 gross square feet (GSF). The 2000 Master Plan provided the guiding framework for long term development. The planning objectives included:

- Accommodate new campus buildings to support academic expansion and anticipated enrollment
- Locate new facilities to create an easily understood and aesthetically pleasing campus spatial organization.
- Organize new residential buildings to enhance the sense of community.
- Introduce new roadways that are efficient
- Create a pedestrian friendly campus with parking at the perimeter.
- Strategically organize buildings and plantings to provide wind screens.
- Establish new central outdoor space at the heart of campus.
- Improve structure and quality of campus landscape.

### 2008 MASTER PLAN

The 2008 Master Plan reinforced many of the same guiding principles as found in the 2000 Master Plan.


This Master Plan highlights opportunities of future athletics expansion to the south, as well as identifies land reserves for future commercial development west of 11th Street and a future retirement residential community.

The following recommendations define the principal proposals of the University of Illinois Springfield Master Plan update in 2008. The primary guiding principles include:

- Locate Athletics expansion to the south of University Drive, east of 11th Street.
- Locate future possible development to the west of 11th Street.
- Locate future possible residential development of the east edge of the campus along West Lake Shore Drive.
- Locate campus storage on the west edge of campus near the existing electrical substation.
- Maintain land reserve areas for future use.
- Maintain the general land use configuration of the campus core within University Drive, as proposed in the 2000 Master Plan.




### **2017 UPDATE TO THE ATHLETICS MASTER PLAN**
