

Who can participate in Commencement?

The following three groups of individuals may be eligible to participate in the upcoming commencement stage experience if they meet all of the listed guidelines. There will be NO exceptions to the criteria listed below. Students cannot participate in more than one ceremony for the same degree program. Therefore, if you have already participated in or were eligible to participate in a PREVIOUS ceremony, you may not participate again.

Summer 2021 and Fall 2021 Graduates:

These graduates are automatically eligible to participate.

Spring 2022 Candidates:

A Spring 2022 graduation application must be on file in the Office of Records and Registration no later than **February 18, 2022.**

Summer 2022 Candidates:

A Summer 2022 graduation application must be on file in the Office of Records and Registration no later than **February 18, 2022.** In addition, an approved Student Petition requesting to participate in commencement must also be on file in the Office of Records and Registration by **February 18, 2022.**

How do I register for Commencement?

Confirmation of intent to participate was due March 21. The form is now closed.

What happens during the Commencement Ceremony?

Graduates will form a procession into the Bank of Springfield Center. After several ceremonial pieces, students will have their name announced, receive a UIS diploma cover, walk across the stage have their photo taken a professional photographer with the Chancellor.

How long will the ceremony last?

Each of the ceremonies will last approximately 1.5 hours.

Do I have to wear a cap and gown?

Academic regalia is required, including a black cap and gown.

When will I be able to purchase a cap and gown?

"Graduate Salute" to be held in the UIS Bookstore (located on the lower level of the Public Affairs Center). Dates and times of the "Graduate Salute" are as follows:

What if I can't attend Graduate Salute?

Online graduates and those who are unable to attend Graduate Salute were provided a link to buy online at the time they completed their Intent to Participate Form.

I was supposed to receive a stole or cord from a specific RSO or group. Will I still receive it?

Cords and stoles provided by Registered Student Organizations, Athletics and campus departments are managed individually by those organizations. Please reach out to your contact within that specific organization.

My guests or I will require accommodations for accessibility. Who should I contact?

What COVID Protocols will be in place for Commencement?

Graduates will receive a passport size proofs in the mail There is no obligation to purchase, and they will have the option of ordering several enlargement packages at a reasonable price. Questions regarding photographs following commencement should be addressed to GradImages (www.gradimages.com/)

When and where are diplomas mailed?

University of Illinois Springfield diplomas are 8.5×11 inches and sent by first-class mail to a student's diploma address approximately nine weeks after your conferral date.

Tickets + Number of Guests

REGISTRATION

Students should have submitted a graduation application to the Office of Records and Registration by **Feb. 18, 2022.**

ELIGIBILITY

Students can only participate in the commencement ceremony in which they are FIRST eligible (based upon the term for which the student submitted a graduation application). Students cannot participate in more than one ceremony for the same degree program.

Students may be eligible to participate in the upcoming commencement ceremonies if they meet all of the listed guidelines. There will be NO exceptions to the criteria listed below.

- Summer 2021 and Fall 2021 Graduates: These graduates are automatically eligible to participate.
- **Spring 2022 Candidates:** A Spring 2022 graduation application must be on file in the Office of Records and Registration no later than **Feb. 18, 2022**.
- Summer 2022 Candidates: A Summer 2022 graduation application must be on file in the Office of Records and Registration no later than **Feb. 18, 2022**. In addition, an approved Student Petition requesting to participate in commencement must also be on file in the Office of Records and Registration by **Feb. 18, 2022**.
- **DPA students:** You must be deemed eligible to participate by **March 31**. Please contact your advisor for additional information.

PARTICIPATION

Graduates are responsible for knowing and adhering to all University of Illinois Springfield (UIS) policies, deadlines, and procedures. Specific graduation and commencement-related information is available in the current catalog and must be followed. An <u>appeal of the commencement participation policy</u> must be made in writing (via letter or email) and must include all documentation that supports the appeal.

The following steps **are required** to participate in Commencement:

- 1. Confirmation of participation by **March 21**. Only those who are eligible were able to submit their intent to participate form, and the form is now closed. This step is required, even for students who are making special cap and gown arrangements (E.g., borrowing a black cap and gown).
- Purchase a cap and gown during Graduate Salute, sponsored by the UIS Bookstore and Herff Jones. Additional graduation merchandise will be available for purchase including diploma frames and announcements. Order your cap and gown during Graduate Salute to avoid late fees.

Cap and gown prices:

- Bachelor Unit: \$40.75 plus tax
- Master Unit & Hood: \$74.25 plus tax
- Doctoral Unit & Hood: \$90.85 plus tax

Units include cap, gown, and tassel. These items are yours to keep, in addition to master and doctoral hoods.

Alternative Cap and Gown Arrangements:

Students making special cap and gown arrangements (E.g., borrowing a black cap and gown) MUST still confirm their participation by submitting an online intent to participate.

Access to your NetID

Your NetID will remain active for three (3) semesters after graduation. After that time, you will no longer be able to use your NetID to access email, Blackboard, or other campus services such as Box, lynda, Office 365, etc. Please see the <u>User</u> <u>Account Lifecycle for NetIDs</u> policy for more information.

Diplomas

On commencement day, diploma covers are presented to students by the Chancellor. Official diplomas are not given out at commencement, but are instead mailed to students separately.

First Destination Survey (FDS)

Photographs

Stoles/Cords

Program marshals have the responsibility for lining up their program's graduates, leading them in the procession to their seats, and leading them across the stage to receive their diploma covers. Because of this responsibility, it is essential that these individuals can be identified by students. Therefore, only program marshals are allowed to wear gold stoles during commencement. Some departments, associations, and groups have chosen to recognize their students by allowing them to wear colored cords or non-gold stoles. Those seeking approval to distribute cords or non-gold stoles to their students must do so by submitting a formal request to the Registrar in the Office of Records and Registration. The request is considered, the Registrar communicates a decision to the appropriate parties, and updates the master list of approved cords, stoles, and miscellaneous items worn at commencement.

BOS Center is located at 1 Convention Center Plaza, Springfield, Illinois 62701

The Center parking ramp is located at the corner of 7th and Washington streets. Other special events are being held downtown on commencement day. Therefore, it is highly recommended that you allow extra time for heavy traffic and parking (parking information can be found below).

- Coming from the SOUTH on I-55 (St. Louis), take the 6th St. Exit (#92) to Downtown Springfield. Stay on 6th St. At Washington St. turn right. Go one (1) block.
- Coming from the NORTH on I-55 (Chicago), take the Clear Lake Avenue Exit (#98). Clear Lake Ave. merges with Jefferson St. Take a left on 7th St. Go one (1) block.
- Coming from the EAST on I-72 (Champaign), continue straight ahead on Clear Lake Ave. It will merge with Jefferson St. Take a left on 7th St. Go one (1) block.
- Coming from the WEST on I-72 (Jacksonville), take the 6th St. Exit to Downtown Springfield. Stay on 6th St. At Washington St. turn right. Go one (1) block.
