Commented [CSL2]: Depending on your instructor's preferences, you may need to provide different information here. You may not even need to include a title page for shorter assignments. Always check with your instructor to learn what they expect for your APA style.

Student papers' title pages require this information, about three or four lines down from the top of the page:

Title of the paper (in bold and "title case")
[extra line]
Student Name
Student Affiliation (department and university)
Course number
Instructor name
Assignment due date ("month day, year" format)

Commented [SC3]: APA papers should have 1-inch margins on all sides of the page. This is typically the default in most word processors, but you can check this in Word by going to the "Layout" tab and selecting the "Margins" option in the ribbon.

Commented [CSL4]: If an abstract is required, it belongs on the second page of your paper. The word "Abstract" should be listed at the top of the page, centered, bolded, and capitalized.

Commented [CSL5]: No first line indent for abstracts. They can be formatted one of two ways, depending on the structure of your paper:

1.A small paragraph that outlines the major talking points, arguments, and conclusions of your work. Keep it simple, and keep it brief (250 words, max)

2.A structured set of paragraphs with bolded labels for each part of your IMRaD report: Introduction, Methods, Results, and Discussion (or others as needed/ required).

This is the second version, for illustration.

Commented [CSL6]: Please note that we have used dummy text for all paragraphing in this sample paper. It is only there to provide a "look and feel" of a paper.

Commented [CSL8]: Once you're ready to actually begin your paper, it belongs on a new page, with the title bolded, in title case, and centered on its own line at the very top.

Commented [CSL9]: Unless your professor states otherwise, papers should be written in 12pt Times New Roman or Calibri font, double-spaced, left-aligned.

First line indents should be used for all paragraphs of text in your paragraph (with the exception of abstracts, covered above, and block quotes, covered below).

Commented [CSL10]: If you use headings in your paper, keep in mind that APA has specific formatting guidelines that break headings down into levels. A Level One heading is bolded, in Title Case, and centered on the page on its own line.

NOTE: You do not need the heading "Introduction" before your first paragraph. That is understood without the label. The title of the paper should serve as a heading for the entire paper; adding another heading under it would be confusing.

Commented [CSL11]: Block quotes are any direct quote from a source that are 40 words or longer in length. To format them in APA style, follow these guidelines:

- Always offer a running acknowledgement to help it “gel” with the previous sentence – typically an “According to Author (Year),” will suffice.
- Place the quote in the paper and indent the entire thing $\frac{1}{2}$ inch (to match the first-line indent of your paragraphs).
- The period goes before the parenthetical in block quotes.
- The parenthetical should only include information you didn’t already provide. Because we already gave a running acknowledgement with the author and the year above, we only need the page number here.
- Lastly, you should never end a paragraph on a block quote, so you should always continue the paragraph with some explanation and offer closure before moving on to the next point. Thus, the next line after your block quote should be flush with the left margin, as you see here.

Commented [CSL12]: If you have a subsection of information within your first heading’s contents, you will want to label it with a Level Two heading. Its formatting is as follows: Bold, Title Case, left-aligned, and on its own line.

Commented [CSL13]: If you need to dip into a Level Three heading, to further parse information within the Level Two subsection, the formatting is as follows: Bold and Italics, Title Case, left-aligned, and on its own line.

Level Three Heading 3

Commented [SC14]: Most student papers should not need to organize further than Level Three headings. If you need a Level Four or Five style heading, please review the guidelines outlined by the Purdue OWL [here](#).

Commented [CSL15]: Your References page should always start on a new page. The word "References" should appear on the first line of the page, centered and bolded.

NOTE: If you only have one source, you should use "Reference" instead.

Commented [CSL16]: References are listed in alphabetical order by whatever comes first in each citation (for any that start with A, An, or The, list by the first *relevant* word).

Commented [CSL17]: References should have a hanging indent, meaning that the first line should be flush with the left margin, and any subsequent lines should be indented half an inch.

NOTE: APA requires you to create a hanging indent using your word processor's paragraph functionality, not by manually hitting 'enter' between each line and tabbing over. Do it right!
