**TASK:** Write a 4-page *expository* essay (double spaced, Font 12, 1" margins) on a topic selected in consultation with your instructor.

**Example 1**: Describe your academic plan to graduate from college. If you do not already have one, develop it before writing the essay. A good way to approach this task is to present the objective (for example, to graduate with a B.A. in Spanish in three years) in your introduction; then focus the main body of your essay on where you currently stand vis-àvis that goal and what steps you will take to work towards that goal; and finally, conclude with a discussion of how this objective will help you achieve broader professional and personal goals.

**Example 2**: What is *Amélie* about? What happens in it? How did the film speak to you? The answers to each of these questions could be (in that order): the introduction, the main body, and the conclusion.
