#### Mission

#### **Teacher Preparation Programs**

The University of Illinois at Springfield offers a minor in Elementary Education and a Minor in Secondary Education with certification in Biological Science, Mathematics, English, and Social Studies. Students either enter with, or earn, a degree in the liberal arts at the same time they are working on certification.

# Student Characteristics

The average undergraduate age is 32; average graduate age is 35, and average doctoral age is 47. Total average student age is 32. Fifty-eight percent of UIS students attend part-time and 42 percent fulltime. Fifty two percent of the student body are undergraduates, 45% are masters students, and .05% are doctoral students. Of the total student body, 60% are women, 12% are minorities, and .04% are international.

# Admission Requirements

#### Admission to Teacher Education:

Candidates must formally apply to the program with a 2.5 GPA and passing scores on the Basic Skills portion of the Illinois State Teacher Certification exam. In addition, they must have completed coursework in Intro To Education, Ed Psych, Child Dev, and 30 hours service learning in an educational setting.

#### Admission to Student Teaching:

Candidates must have completed at least 120 clock hours of approved pre-student-teaching clinical experiences, have a 2.5 GPA overall, a 2.75 GPA in their major, and a 3.0 GPA in their professional education courses. Department approval is required.

## Accreditation

The State Teacher Certification Board/Illinois State Board of Education approves all of the University of Illinois at Springfield's teacher preparation programs.

# **Teacher Education Vision**

Teacher education at UIS seeks to prepare students to be proficient in academic content and professional skills, understand the nature of child development and learning, be sensitive to and aware of issues of diversity, and be active decision makers and critical thinkers.

## **Best Practices**

Students seeking initial certification complete a major in an arts or science discipline. Attention to diversity is a key component of all courses offered in the teacher education minors.

Competency in the use of technology is integrated into and expected in all courses offered in the teacher education minors.

Professors in the teacher education program have received the Spencer Award for service two of the last three years.

UIS has a 100% pass rate on the content area exams for the last three years. UIS has chartered a chapter of Kappa Delta Pi, an international honor society in education.
